As a parent, you play a key role in terms of your child's schooling – smooth collaboration between school and parents is crucial for academic success.

Alongside information about the education system in Thurgau, this brochure also provides lots of details about further information and courses. We would be delighted if they interested you and you chose to make use of them.

Overview of key information

Compulsory schooling lasts eleven years. All children and young people resident in the Canton of Thurgau may attend a state-run school free of charge.

Children start their compulsory education with two years of kindergarten. After this, they attend primary school for six years and secondary school (lower-secondary level) for three years. This marks the end of their compulsory schooling.

Subsequent to this, young people can progress to upper-secondary level in various ways. Around two-thirds of young people in Thurgau undertake an apprenticeship that qualifies them to practice their chosen profession. To complement their apprenticeship, high-performing young people can complete a Federal Vocational Baccalaureate, which provides them with direct access to a university of applied sciences (tertiary level). Around a third of young people at upper-secondary level pursue an academic course at an academic upper-secondary level school or a specialised school, in preparation for courses at tertiary level.

An upper-secondary level qualification enables the holder to attend various higher education institutions at tertiary level, depending on whether the qualification in question is an apprenticeship, a Federal Vocational Baccalaureate or an academic qualification attained at an academic upper-secondary level school or a specialised school.

A HIGHLY FLEXIBLE EDUCATION SYSTEM

The Swiss education system is highly flexible: there are various ways to join or switch to a course or a school, or to catch up on or complete a particular course.

4 Introduction

Early-years support

Getting off to a great start

Parents hold primary responsibility for bringing up their children: family is the first and most important place for early-years development. Undertaking day-to-day activities with their family offers children key opportunities for learning, be it with others, through play or through movement.

Children are born capable, active and curious. They learn from experience, via relationships and, above all, through playing with other children.

Early-years support assists young children and families where needed. This provision includes midwives, paediatricians, advice for parents, parent education, playgroups, day nurseries and childminders.

Multilingualism

If your child is being brought up multilingual, talk to them in your strongest language. This ensures deep, lively conversations. At the same time, your child needs knowledge of German so they can start kindergarten. Facilitate contact with German-speaking peers and adults for your child when they are as young as possible. Playgroups and nurseries are the perfect places to learn German.

Mandatory selective support for preschool language development

In 2024, the Canton of Thurgau is launching mandatory selective support for preschool language development so that every child can get off to a good start in kindergarten. Language skills are crucial for communicating with other children and adults, as well as for success academically.

As a result, children with insufficient knowledge of German receive preschool language support a year before starting kindergarten. The nature of this support can vary from one school district to another, but it potentially includes playgroups, nurseries or childminders. The school district is responsible for assessing language skills and coordinating this provision.

Preschool children can access various assistance and support services, such as speech therapy, psychomotorics or remedial early-years education.



The state school system

The foundation for life-long learning

State school provision spans eleven years. It is divided into kindergarten, primary school and secondary school. Attending a state-run school is compulsory and free of charge.

Kindergarten

Kindergarten lasts two years. It assists with children's development across subjects and through play, preparing them for subject-specific learning at primary school. Children are generally four years old when they start kindergarten. Parents can delay their child's starting kindergarten by one year. All the information parents need about starting school can be obtained from their local school.

Primary level

Primary school lasts six years. At primary school, pupils learn knowledge and skills in languages, mathematics, 'nature, people, society', art, music, 'movement and sport', 'media and IT' and 'education for sustainable development'. In addition, their personal, methodological and social skills are fostered.

Secondary level

Secondary school lasts three years. Pupils expand and deepen the knowledge and skills they acquired at primary school. In addition, subjects such as 'nature and technology' and 'economics, labour, household' are taught and compulsory electives offered. Secondary school prepares pupils for vocational education and training or further schooling. Secondary schooling is divided into two types (basic and advanced requirements) and various different levels. The schools ensure pupils can move between achievement levels.

Curriculum for schools in Thurgau

The <u>curriculum</u> describes what pupils should be able to know and do. Cycle 1 encompasses kindergarten and the first two years of primary school (up to the end of Year 2). Cycle 2 encompasses four years of primary school (Years 3 to 6), while Cycle 3 encompasses the three years of secondary school (Years 1 to 3).

The academic year and holidays

The academic year begins after the summer holidays. The 13 weeks of holidays are divided across the academic year. The <u>Ferienplan (holiday plan)</u> can be found at <u>avtg.ch</u>.

School location and journey to school

Pupils attend the state-run school at their place of residence. The school authority is responsible for allocating pupils to individual schools, while the school's management assigns pupils to classes. In principle, children travel to school independently. Their journey to school is the responsibility of their parent/guardian, but the school authority ensures their journey is as safe as possible.

Lesson times (block times) and daycare provision

Generally, children have at least three hours of teaching each morning at kindergarten and three and a half hours at primary school. Each school organises their lunchtime and afternoon teaching differently. There are no lessons on Wednesday afternoons at kindergartens and primary schools. Many school districts offer daycare services (supervised sessions, help with homework, lunch provision, etc.). In principle, childcare services are subject to a fee.

Homework

Homework enables pupils to reinforce and extend the topics they discussed at school and gives parents an insight into the topics being covered at school.

Report cards and assessment

From primary school onwards, pupils' achievements in each subject are assessed in words (Year 1/2 of primary school) or marks (from Year 3 of primary school). In addition, their attitude to learning, working and socialising with others is appraised. A review meeting is held annually with their class teacher. Pupils receive a report card at the end of each academic year (for primary school) or the end of each semester (for secondary school).

Assistance and support services

Every child receives support at school in line with their abilities and needs. There are various forms of support available for pupils requiring particular assistance, or those with particular strengths and talents. The provision available locally is described in the support concept of the school district in question.

There is also cantonal provision for particularly gifted, high-performing pupils from Year 3 of primary school onwards. They attend workshops during lesson time or can take part in stimulating events outside the school day to expand their interests. Both services are free, except travel costs.

Special schools

There is special provision to support children and young people with physical, mental or linguistic disabilities or problematic behaviour. Whenever possible, the child should attend their local school, where they will be supported within the regular class through integrated special schooling. The school authority determines how this is put into practice. If it is not possible to support the child within the regular class, they will attend a special school. Special schools specialise in particular types of disability or learning and behavioural difficulties.

Parental rights and obligations

Parents are responsible for making sure their children attend school regularly. Smooth collaboration with the child's teacher helps the child feel comfortable at school. Regular discussions about the child's behaviour and performance, and participation in parents' evening and other school events, are helpful. Parents have the right to sit in on lessons, in consultation with the teacher.

CANTONAL INTEGRATION COURSES

The canton of Thurgau offers cantonal integration courses for young people living in Thurgau who do not speak German as a first language. The focus is on learning German and on general education. The aim is to supply participants with the qualifications for secondary school, an apprenticeship (Federal Certificate or Diploma of Vocational Education and Training) or further education. The courses are aligned with each other and structured flexibly: as soon as a student has reached the level of German for the next course, they are able to switch to this course.

INTEGRATION COURSE 1A

Some secondary schools offer the upstream Integration Course 1a (integration class) for 12- to 16-year-olds. The course teaches German in preparation for attending regular secondary school.

Vocational education and training

Vocational education

Vocational education and training lays the foundations for lifelong learning and opens up an array of career options. More than two-thirds of young people opt for this route after completing their compulsory schooling.

Businesses in Thurgau are very keen to train young people, which, in turn, ensures a wide range of educational opportunities. Young people work at an apprenticeship host company and attend classes at a vocational education institution. Inter-company courses are also held. Vocational education and training courses lead to a Federal Diploma of Vocational Education and Training or a Federal Certificate of Vocational Education and Training.

Duration

Vocational education and training with a Federal Certificate of Vocational Education and Training lasts two years and with a Federal Diploma of Vocational Education and Training lasts three or four years.

FEDERAL VOCATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

The Federal Vocational Baccalaureate supplements vocational education and encompasses a demanding, expanded general education. In conjunction with a Federal Diploma of Education and Training from a three- or four-year vocational education and training course, the Federal Vocational Baccalaureate enables the holder to be admitted a university of applied sciences without undergoing an examination. The Federal Vocational Baccalaureate can be completed either during (BM1) or after (BM2) vocational education and training.

INFORMATICS SECONDARY SCHOOL

Informatics Secondary School (Informatikmittelschule, IMS) offers vocational education and training within an academic structure combined with a Federal Vocational Baccalaureate. Students will graduate as information technologists with a Federal Diploma of Vocational Education and Training and a Federal Vocational Baccalaureate certification in business and business services.

CANTONAL COURSES

LOW-THRESHOLD EDUCATIONAL PROVISION (NIEDER-SCHWELLIGES AUSBILDUNGSANGEBOT, NAB)

Low-threshold educational provision (niederschwelliges Ausbildungsangebot, NAB) is open to young people from the Canton of Thurgau aged 15 to 18 who have completed compulsory schooling and do not meet the requirements for vocational education and training (Federal Certificate/ Diploma of Vocational Education and Training).

LOW-THRESHOLD INTEGRATION EDUCATION (NIEDER-SCHWELLIGE INTEGRATIONSAUSBILDUNG, NIA)/ INTRODUCTORY INTEGRATION COURSE (INTEGRATIONS-VORLEHRE, INVOL+)

Low-threshold integration education (niederschwellige Integrationsausbildung, NIA) draws on low-threshold education provision (niederschwellige Ausbildungsangebot, NAB) and is aimed at non-native speakers aged 18 and above for whom cantonal integration courses are not suitable. Students can attend an introductory integration course (Integrationsvorlehre, INVOL+) in their second year, if certain conditions are met.

Baccalaureate schools

The path to studying at a Swiss federal institute of technology, university, teacher-training institution, university of applied sciences or higher education institution

Academic baccalaureate schools prepare students to study at a Swiss federal institute of technology, university or teacher-training institution. The Specialised Baccalaureate also opens up certain routes to universities of applied sciences. The specialised school diploma enables admission to higher vocational schools.

ACADEMIC BACCALAUREATE SCHOOLS

Academic baccalaureate schools provide a broad-based general education and offer preparation for study at higher education institutions. Pupils graduate with a baccalaureate recognised in Switzerland. It enables the holder to study at all university-level higher educational institutions in Switzerland (universities, Swiss federal institutes of technology), teacher-training institutions and, after a one-year internship, universities of applied sciences, too.

THURGAU-SCHAFFHAUSEN ADULTS' BACCALAU-REATE SCHOOL

Individuals who meet the necessary requirements can take the academic baccalaureate part-time at the Thurgau-Schaffhausen Adults' Baccalaureate School (TSME) or, following the preparation course, take the supplementary examination.

ACADEMIC BACCALAUREATE FOR ADULTS

Duration

7 semesters

Admission conditions

In principle, the first semester is open to anyone who holds a secondary school qualification (advanced level) and can provide proof of at least two years of work experience. Apprenticeships, internships, proof of unemployment, time spent running a household and childcare count towards this requirement.

Admission to a higher semester (semesters 2 to 6) is open to applicants who have attended a general school at upper-secondary level (at least to the extent of the semesters skipped). School attendance must be proven with report cards.

PREPARATION COURSE (PASSERELLE)

High-performing graduates of the Federal Vocational Baccalaureate or the Specialised Baccalaureate can attend a one-year full-time preparation course at the TSME for an internal supplementary examination recognised across Switzerland, which will also qualify participants for admission to a university course.

SPECIALISED SCHOOLS AND THE SPECIALISED BACCALAUREATE

The Specialised Baccalaureate course generally lasts four years and prepares the student to study health, social work, or communication and IT at a university of applied sciences. A Specialised Baccalaureate in education enables the holder to study at a teacher-training institution. Students not wishing to take a Specialised Baccalaureate can continue their education at a higher vocational school after three years, with a specialised school diploma. The Specialised Baccalaureate in education is offered at Kantonsschule Frauenfeld.

Higher vocational training

Management education and specialisation for professionals

Higher vocational training lays the groundwork for demanding specialist or management roles. It enables the holder to specialise, extends their specialist skills and provides a qualification in the field of corporate management.

- Higher vocational training encompasses:
- federal examinations (Federal Professional Examination FPE and Advanced Federal Professional Examination AFPE)
- training courses at the higher vocational schools

FEDERAL EXAMINATIONS – FEDERAL PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION FPE AND ADVANCED FEDERAL PROFESSIONAL EX-AMINATION AFPE

Professional examinations enable professionals to gain an initial area of expertise and specialisation in their profession, following vocational education and training. Access to an Advanced Federal Professional Examination is generally contingent on successful completion of a Federal Professional Examination. The Advanced Federal Professional Examination certifies professionals as experts in their field and prepares them to manage a company.

HIGHER VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS

The courses offered by higher vocational schools are highly practical in nature. They focus on tangible issues relating to services, operations, workshops and manufacturing. Graduates of a higher vocational school often take up middle management roles.

In the Canton of Thurgau, there are the following options in terms of higher educational schools:

higher vocational school for nursing, higher vocational school for business and higher vocational school for technology, with various courses.

Higher education institutions

Studying for top-notch qualifications

Switzerland is home to various kinds of higher education institutions: universities, universities of applied sciences and teacher-training institutions.

Universities are primarily active in fundamental research, with their teaching based on this. Universities of applied sciences have a stronger focus on vocational practice and applied research and development. Teacher-training institutions train teachers for various levels of schooling, offer continuing education and training and engage in research of relevance to the sector.

PÄDAGOGISCHE HOCHSCHULE THURGAU (THURGAU TEACHER-TRAINING COLLEGE)

Thurgau Teacher Training College (PHTG) is the only higher education institution in the canton. It trains teachers and headteachers for all levels of schooling, along with experts in early years. Its courses for lower-secondary and upper-secondary levels and early years are offered in collaboration with the University of Konstanz.

KINDERGARTEN LOWER LEVEL

Duration

3 years. 2 years for graduates of the Pädagogische Maturitätsschule Kreuzlingen.

Admission conditions

Academic baccalaureate, Federal Vocational Baccalaureate with preparation course, qualification from a university of applied sciences (potentially subject to conditions), Specialised Baccalaureate in Education. (Other routes of admission are possible via an entrance process.)

PRIMARY LEVEL

Duration

3 years. Two years for graduates of the Pädagogische Maturitätsschule Kreuzlingen.

Admission conditions

Academic baccalaureate, Federal Vocational Baccalaureate with preparation course, qualification from a university of applied sciences (potentially subject to conditions), Specialised Baccalaureate in Education. (other routes of admission are possible via an entrance process.)

LOWER-SECONDARY LEVEL

Duration

4.5 years of full-time study for the regular course 2 years of part-time study for adding an extra level Duration can vary when studied part-time

Admission conditions

Academic baccalaureate or equivalent qualification, or teaching diploma for primary level

UPPER-SECONDARY LEVEL

Duration

1 year full-time, up to 3 years part-time

Admission conditions

Specialist Master's degree from a university (Master's degree, diploma, licentiate degree, 'Magister' degree) in a subject taught at Swiss academic upper-secondary level schools.

MASTER IN EARLY CHILDHOOD

Duration

2 years full-time, generally 3 years part-time

Admission conditions

A bachelor's degree from a university, teacher-training institution or university of applied sciences in psychology, education, social or sports education or another relevant field.

OTHER HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS

Switzerland

The Canton of Thurgau is just a short distance away from various higher education institutions offering a very wide range of courses. The key universities in the region are <u>OST – Ostschweizer Fachhochschule</u>, the intercantonale <u>Hochschule für Heilpädagogik</u> (HfH) and <u>Zurich University of</u> <u>Applied Sciences</u> (ZHAW). Thurgau students can access all higher education institutions via intercantonal agreements. Under these agreements, the Canton of Thurgau pays contributions (school fees) for its students.

Konstanz

The <u>University of Konstanz</u> and the <u>Hochschule für Technik</u>, <u>Wirtschaft und</u> <u>Gestaltung</u> (HTWG) in Konstanz are of significant importance to Thurgau.

Wissenschaftsverbund Vierländerregion Bodensee

The <u>Wissenschaftsverbund Vierländerregion Bodensee</u> operates one of its two offices in Kreuzlingen. This association encompasses 25 universities, universities of applied sciences and teacher-training institutions in the greater Lake Constance area. It encourages collaboration among these higher education institutions in various ways, including by developing collaborative, cross-border courses.

If a child experiences challenges at school, they can attend a free educational psychology or speech therapy consultation. Parents and the school receive information on handling a child's strengths and weaknesses, along with recommendations for support. This service is only available for children and young people under the age of 18.

EDUCATION CONTRIBUTIONS AND CONTRIBU-TIONS TO SCHOOLS OUTSIDE THE CANTON

Grants and loans

If a student does not have sufficient funds for a particular course, the canton can offer support in the form of grants and loans. Grants are generally awarded for first courses at upper-secondary level (apprenticeships, secondary school, etc.) and tertiary level (degrees at higher vocational schools and higher education institutions). Loans primarily come into play for second courses of study.

The financial circumstances (tax certificates) of the applicant themselves or their parents are decisive for the calculation.

School fees

Various regional and intercantonal agreements ensure that Thurgau residents have free access to all key educational courses not offered by the canton itself, and which, therefore, must be completed at institutions outside the canton. If the course of study is recognised in Switzerland and/or the canton, and covered by an agreement, the Canton of Thurgau will cover the course fees (not to be confused with the semester fees to be paid by the student themselves). In instances where a Thurgau resident has to pay higher course fees for a recognised course of study than those paid by students from the local canton, the canton will refund these additional costs if there is no comparable course available in the canton.
